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Committee Information

Camarillo Council on Aging

The Camarillo Council on Aging's Executive Board consists of 5 members. The Board meets on the third Tuesday of the month at 3:00 p.m. The purpose of the Board is to identify the needs of senior citizens of Camarillo and act as an intermediary between senior citizens and the City Council. The Board serves in an advisory capacity, seeks contributions and funds for senior programs, and encourages older citizens to participate in the community. Applicants must be residents of the City. The term of appointment is two years.

Camarillo Ranch Foundation Board of Directors

The Camarillo Ranch Foundation consists of 15 members, five of which may reside outside the city limits within the boundaries of the Mesa Union School District, Pleasant Valley School District, or the Somis Union School District. The Board meets on the first Wednesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. The purpose of the Foundation is to provide fundraising and oversight for the operation, maintenance and restoration of the historic ranch house. The site is to be used for historical and educational programs, community events, and commercial purposes. The term of appointment is three years. If appointed to the Camarillo Ranch Foundation Board, you must complete and file a Statement of Economic Interest form with the City Clerk. Citizen Advisory Committee on Land Use

The Citizen Advisory Committee on Land Use advises the Camarillo Community Development Commission and City Council on Council initiated land use matters including proposed amendments to the General Plan, specific plans, and design guidelines. The Committee meets on an as-needed basis during evening hours. Applicants must be residents of the City. The term of appointment is two years.

Community Development Block Grant Citizen Loan Committee

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Loan Committee reviews homeowner applications for the rehabilitation of their houses in Camarillo. The CDBG Loan Committee meets intermittently. There are two public members serving on the Committee. These individuals should have backgrounds in banking and real estate. Applicants must be residents of the City of Camarillo. The term of appointment is four years.

Investment Committee

The Investment Committee meets on the third Wednesday of each month in the afternoon to review and discuss monthly investment reports, investment strategy, and investment and banking procedures. There are two public members serving on the Committee. These individuals must have experience in accounting, banking or financial investments. Applicants must be residents of the City of Camarillo. The term of appointment is two years.

Planning Commission

Planning Commission reviews matters related to land use such as the City's general plan, specific plans, zoning, use permits and subdivisions. The Planning Commission meets on the first and third Tuesdays of each month at 7:30 p.m. The term of appointment is four years. If appointed to the Planning Commission, you must complete and file a Statement of Economic Interest form with the City Clerk. Please visit www.fppc.ca.gov for information regarding the form.

Rent Review Mediation Commission

The Rent Review Mediation Commission is charged with the responsibility of assisting in the mediation of rent disputes. The Commission meets on an as-needed basis and can be scheduled during daytime or evening hours. The commission consists of seven members. Commissioners are appointed for a four-year term and serve at the pleasure of the city council. **Two members are tenants** in the city (one each from a mobile home park and residential rental complex), and **two members are owners** (one each from a mobile home park and residential rental complex, who need not be residents of the city), and the **three members are city residents** who are neither a tenant nor an owner of a residential rental complex or mobilehome park. If appointed to the Rent Review Commission, you must complete and file a Statement of Economic Interest form with the City Clerk. Please visit www.fppc.ca.gov for information regarding the form.

Ventura County Air Pollution Control District Advisory Committee

The Ventura County Air Pollution Control District Advisory Committee reviews proposed rules from the Air Pollution Control District staff prior to the Board holding a public hearing. The Committee occasionally reviews air-related issues. The committee meets on the fourth Tuesday of every month at 7:30 p.m. in Ventura. Applicants must be resident of the City of Camarillo. The term of appointment is four years.

Ventura County Area Agency on Aging Advisory Board

The Ventura County Area Agency on Aging Advisory Board is a public agency established for the purpose of the development, implementation and evaluation of a comprehensive and coordinated service delivery system for the elderly in Ventura County. The Board meets on the second Wednesday of the month at 9:00 a.m. in Ventura and additional meetings are called as necessary. Appointees will also attend the Camarillo Council on Aging meetings to report back information. The Camarillo Council on Aging meets monthly on the 3rd Tuesday at 8:30 a.m. Applicants must be a resident of the City. The term of appointment is two years.

Ventura County Area Housing Authority

The Area Housing Authority is a catalyst to provide opportunities and assistance to people in need of affordable housing through partnerships with the communities it serves which includes the cities of Camarillo, Fillmore, Ojai, Moorpark, Simi Valley, Thousand Oaks, and the County of Ventura. The Area Housing Authority of the County of Ventura meets the second and fourth Wednesday of each month at 3:00 p.m. in Newbury Park. The Authority is governed by a 15 member Board. Applicants must be City residents. The term of appointment is four years. Board members must complete and file a Statement of Economic Interest Form 700 Please visit www.fppc.ca.gov for information regarding the form.

Ventura County Citizens Transportation Advisory Committee

The Ventura County Citizens Transportation Advisory Committee reviews and makes recommendations on countywide transportation matters. The Committee meets the second Tuesday of each month at 1:30 p.m. in Ventura. Applicants must be residents of the City of Camarillo. The term of appointment is four years.

Southern California Library Cooperative System Advisory Board

The Southern California Library Cooperative System Advisory Board (SAB) is composed of citizens appointed by their libraries to represent the users of that library's community. They provide the SCLC Administrative Council and Executive Director with feedback directly from the users to assist in the development of the system plan of service, provide advice on the need for services and programs, and assist in evaluating services provided by the system.

Applicants must live within the Camarillo Public Library service area, be knowledgeable about libraries in general and about the Camarillo Public Library in particular. Preference will be given to applicants who have experience in dealing with and understanding the exceptional service needs of those not adequately met by traditional library service patterns, including, but not limited to, those persons who are geographically isolated, economically disadvantaged, functionally illiterate, non-English-speaking or limited English-speaking ability, shut-in, institutionalized, or handicapped. The SAB meets in the fall and in May in Southern California (meeting locations vary, but the meetings are usually held in Los Angeles County). SAB members must provide their own transportation to the meetings; mileage reimbursement is provided. The term of appointment is two years.
